FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a pre-apprenticeship? Worcester Building Pathways is a pre-apprenticeship training program designed to give you the foundational skills and knowledge necessary to understand the construction industry. This training will allow you to gain acceptance into a state registered union apprenticeship.

What are the eligibility requirements? All applicants must be 18 years of age or older, have a high school diploma or equivalent, have reliable transportation, be physically able to work in construction, be low-income, be authorized to work in the U.S. and consent to Drug Testing.

What will I learn in the program? Worcester Building Pathways will provide you with the knowledge and skills necessary to enter into a state-registered Building Trades apprenticeship program through Career Readiness and Occupational Skills Training, with classroom and hands-on learning experiences. You will also receive coordinated case management and placement services to help you achieve your career goals. This year's program has a road construction focus because these skills are in demand with local contractors.

How much does it cost? There is **no cost** to participate in Worcester Building Pathways. In fact, participants will receive a small stipend, free set of work boots, and safety gear.

When and where are classes? Classes are held at various training locations in Worcester, Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Transportation for out-of-Worcester trips will be provided. The next cohort will begin February 2019.

Will I receive any other services through Worcester Building Pathways? Case management services will be provided as needed for each participant beginning at the start of the program and through successful placement. Case management will include career counseling and/or referral and follow-up for issues such as childcare, transportation, housing, healthcare, financial services, and legal services.

What is an apprenticeship? Apprenticeships allow you to **earn while you learn**. First-year union apprentices earn approximately the same amount most college students pay for a year's tuition! Once you become an apprentice, you work and attend classroom training.

Which building trades have apprenticeships? Building trades with apprenticeship programs include boilermakers, bricklayers, carpenters, commercial drivers, electrical workers, elevator constructors, insulators, iron workers, laborers, millwrights, operating engineers, painters, plasterers and cement masons, plumbers and sprinklerfitters, roofers, sheet metal workers and many more!
